As pointed out by a mathematician colleague, this statement is false. The first sentence of our article should have been: “We were surprised to note that a winner of the Fields Medal [the highest award in mathematics, named after John Charles Fields and awarded by the International Mathematical Union (IMU) at its quadrennial congress] had a nonnegligible percentage of uncited publications.”
